






21 - 22 JULY 2023 KRANZLER ECK, BERLIN

LAS Art Foundation is pleased to present the Berlin premiere of UKI, a feature-length science fiction film by artist Shu Lea Cheang (b. 1954, Taiwan). Developed as a sequel to Cheang's cyberpunk film I.K.U. (2000), UKI is the culmination of a 14-year artistic exploration into viral love, bio-hacking and queer futures. The film will be screened on two consecutive evenings at Kranzler Eck (21 - 22 July), and will be accompanied by a panel discussion and special performances from Aérea Negrot, Royal Dust, Mieko Suzuki, Dennis Gundlach, Saint Precious, Rey KM Domurat and Tobias Freund, among others.

Widely celebrated for her genre-bending contributions to queer cinema and media art, Cheang's multidisciplinary work deals with issues of institutional oppression, social inequality, sexual politics and global capitalism. Centring the lives of marginalised communities, Cheang often employs science fiction to project new social norms and alternative imaginaries surrounding bodily agency and autonomy. As an early practitioner of Net Art, Cheang has likewise explored the narrative potential of new technologies since the 1990s. Paying particular attention to technology's impact on the body and social interactions, her early interest in cyberspace and networked technologies has given way to a critical exploration of digital surveillance and biotechnology in more recent years.

UKI offers a timely look at how bodies are regulated, policed, optimised and exploited through a sci-fi narrative that echoes the recent pandemic. It looks at biomedical practices such as genetic engineering and data harvesting, as well as the effects of toxic waste pollution. Continuing the I.K.U. storyline, the film follows Reiko, a humanoid replicant created to harvest orgasm data by the biotechnology company GENOM Corp. Now a piece of obsolete technology, Reiko is dumped on a landfill site known as E-Trashville, where they attempt to rebuild and reboot their system. With help from the various mutants, replicants and transgenic creatures who live among the e-waste, Reiko re-emerges as the virus 'UKI' to save the population from GENOM Corp.







Alongside the screenings, LAS will present an accompanying installation and events programme to expand upon UKI's cinematic universe. Installations and performances derived from scenes of UKI are restaged including: projection mapping of blood cells on the dome of Kranzler Eck and radio antenna installation by Elektra, Coquetta sound objects performed by Ioana Vreme Moser, multi-screen display of GENOM Ads by VFX designer Gonzalo Martín Martín and a reenactment of E-Trashville's transgenic inhabitants performed by Mmakgosi Kgabi and members of the public, created with UKI's virtual universe production team, Roland Lauth, Xiyue Hu and Xing Xiao. On Friday 21 July 2023, Cheang will be joined by gueer cultural theorist João Florêncio to introduce the film ahead of its Berlin premiere. Special performances featuring the film's cast, Tyra Wigg, Asia-James Ryan Ryyves Thomas, Alan Chen, Jin, Bernard J. Butler and sound designer Sky Deep will take place after the screening. On Saturday 22 July 2023, a musical programme inspired by UKI and I.K.U.'s soundtracks will feature live performances and jam sessions by Royal Dust, Mieko Suzuki, Dennis Gundlach, Saint Precious, Rey KM Domurat and Tobias Freund, led by Aérea Negrot, a Venezuelan singer, electronic musician and producer who adapted the score of I.K.U. for UKI.

As a net art pioneer, her project *BRANDON* (1998–99) was the first web artwork commissioned and collected by New York's Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum. Her feature length films, *FRESH KILL* (1994), *I.K.U.* (2000) and *FLUIDø* (2017), collectively helped define a new genre of queer sci-fi cinema. In 2019, Cheang represented Taiwan at the 58th International Art Exhibition of La Biennale di Venezia with her work 3x3x6.
